Why social rides appeal to many

Amelia Island's Wednesday ride offers special treat

Of all of the weekly rides hosted by NFBC, one stands out for its route, its scenery and for featuring an ice cream social.

That's right, ice cream. Needless to say, this is a social ride.

It starts at 10 a.m. each Wednesday at Peters Point, a beautiful seaside park in Fernandina Beach. If you get there early, you can drive on the beach or linger on new boardwalks to watch the waves.

The NFBC group pedals southward a few miles along the Amelia Island Trail before stopping at Burney Park at American Beach. Another boardwalk, sand dunes, rolling waves. And then it is more miles of the trail and bike lanes along A1A to the Amelia Island State Park and the Nassau River.

There the group crosses the George Crady Bridge Fishing Pier, weaving among fishermen and their carts and buckets and rods. Sometimes the riders see a fish being landed. Mostly, though, the cyclists witness patience and waiting, which fishermen excel at.

The turnaround is a few yards farther at Sawpit Creek Park on the north end of Big Talbot Island State Park.

Weeds grow at closed end of Timucuan Trail boardwalk



Boardwalk entrance at the Nassau Bridge may open next year after safety concerns are addressed.

A newly built boardwalk, which was intended as a pathway from the Timucuan Trail on Big Talbot Island to a bridge across the Nassau River, stops just short of the bridge.

Its entrance is blocked.
Weeds grow on the boardwalk. The nearest entry is
several hundred yards from
the bridge, forcing park pedestrians, cyclists and birdwatchers to go along the busy
highway, parallel to the boardwalk in order to continue
north on the Timucuan Trail.

A design flaw stopped the boardwalk at river's edge after it was determined that the original plan to route the pathway under A1A at the Nassau Bridge wasn't feasible due to projected erosion caused by persistent northeast winds.

For two years officials of the state Department of Transportation, the City of Jacksonville, bicycle and pedestrian advocacy groups and others have been haggling over how to best facilitate cyclists and pedestrians crossing A1A at that point to get from the boardwalk to a parking lot at Sawpit Creek Park and a pathway to the George Crady Bridge, which leads to the next segment of the Timucuan Trail.

Five new routes for Tour de Forts

The Tour de Forts Classic on April 24 will feature five entirely new routes from 26 to 101 miles long.

TdF Director Terry Takken has mapped out courses that center on St. Augustine with all riders cycling past the Castillo de San Marcos.

All but the shortest route will continue south along the beach to Fort Matanzas. Most riders will then turn inland to the Palatka-to-St. Augustine trail and ride along the St. Johns River.

Preliminary maps will be available when registration opens early next year. Presently Terry is working with Dave Townley to finalize rest stop locations. Several of us accompanied Terry on a site visit to the new ride venue, St. Augustine High School.

We encourage everyone to come out in April and "Ride with us in the footsteps of history."

Marketing success

The success of our last several major rides is directly related to marketing efforts to reach both members and non-members. Mike Spino did a fantastic job as Marketing and Promotions Manager for the last three Endless Summer Watermelon Rides and the Tour de Forts.





'Riding with the Voices In My Head'

Over the past 4 years, I have ridden 250 centuries. That is over 1,600 hours of cycling, mostly riding alone.

Sometimes I ride just listening to the voices in my head. However, when I am alone I prefer to listen to my iPod. Cycling in Florida with headphones is illegal so I do all of my iPod listening through speakers attached to my bicycle.

For several years, I used the \$25 Ivation Bicycle Speaker. I liked this speaker because the rechargeable battery lasts for about 15 hours.

It had external audio controls so I could increase or decrease the volume easily while riding. The volume is loud enough to hear while riding next to heavy traffic. Best of all, the speaker is design as a storage case that straps over the handlebars.

I have used this type of speaker for thousands and thousands of miles. However, the speaker wiring is not very sturdy so after riding hundreds of bumpy roads the wiring comes lose and I have had to keep replacing the speakers.

One time when the Ivation speaker broke. I needed a replacement right away, so I bought a \$15 iHome Portable Speaker at Walmart.

It is about the size and weight of a golf ball. Although not made for bicycles, it easily fits in my top tube bag along with my iPod. This speaker has very surprising volume and bass for its size.

For my last birthday, I got a bright green Iwerkz Bottle Blaster Speaker. It costs \$30 and is designed to fit inside a standard bike water bottle holder.

The top volume control knob makes volume adjustments a simple task while riding. It also has blue tooth controls, which I





have not yet used. However, it takes up the space needed for a water bottle, the volume is not loud enough to hear over traffic and the rechargeable battery only lasts for 3 to 4 hours. It is very durable and waterproof, so it would make a great speaker for a beach bike.

I usually do not listen to music when I am riding. Instead, I listen to podcasts that I download free. Podcasts with rich deep bass voices are easiest to hear over traffic. thus the Thomas Jefferson Hour is a podcast that I listen to every week. I have listened to lots of bicycle related podcasts over the years. Here are my top three bicycle related podcasts:

- 1. WJCU- The Outspoken Cyclist: a weekly 1-hour show with interviews, commentary, ideas, advocacy, and everything connected with bicycling.
- 2. The Spokesmen Cycling Roundtable Podcast: Features cycling media personalities, manufacturers, observers, and others who love bikes.

They talk about trending topics in a roundtable format with commentary on bicycle

racing, bicycle industry news, advocacy and bicycle trends.

3. The Cycling News Podcast: This is a bicycle racing show with interviews with cycling stars such as Fabian Cancellara, Peter Sagan, and Mark Cavendish.

They also cover women's professional racing. There are daily broadcasts during the Tour De France. Cycling News is out of the UK so the accents and terminology can be amusing.

Download any of these podcasts free from the podcast websites or through iTunes.

Meanwhile, weeds continue to grow on the boardwalk between the blocked end point and the boardwalk's next entry point several hundred feet south of the bridge.

NFBC member Mike Pikula, a long-time advocate for the Amelia Island Trail, says it appears FDOT has decided on a plan for a special purpose crosswalk that would feature an on-demand button that would activate flashing lights 400 feet north and south of the crosswalk and a recommended 45 mph speed when the lights are flashing.

A barrier fence would be installed to direct cyclists and pedestrians into the crosswalk.

"Last I heard, FDOT was pressing on with the crosswalk to be built in spring 2016,"

Pikula said in a note updating NFBC President Mark Atkins.

Other options considered have deemed practical or feasible. included building an elevated walkover across A1A at that point and slowing traffic to

30-35 mph and adding speed bumps, neither of which FDOT

"FDOT has to maintain a reasonable balance between needs and desire of many motorists

and a few alternative users," Pikula said. "It's a shame it took the process so long, but I believe FDOT was trying to let everyone be heard."

After a rest, it's back across the bridge and more well-wishes from fishermen and back on to the trail. The pace is conversation speed, 12 mph; if someone goes 14 mph, that's considered a breakaway.

Oddly, though, on any given Wednesday, some of the club's most accomplished riders are likely to be on this ride -- multiple-century riders such as Jim Ingham, George Katras and Jodie Kubiak -- and they seem to handle the slower pace well.

The ride leaders are Susan Taylor and Dan Lehmann.
This ride started about a year ago, but it took on a different dimension last spring when Ann Duncan treated the group to ice cream at the Omni Resort's Marche Burette market and deli before she headed north to Maine for the summer.

And there's a porch on which to linger with the ice cream before finishing the 18-mile ride.

The NFBC hosts a variety of social rides throughout the region, usually about 20 miles at a slower pace.

On Saturday mornings, Clyde Riggs leads rides that move around -- in St. Augustine, Mandarin and St. Johns.

On Sunday afternoons, Len Burroughs leads weekly rides that rotate in Riverside, Mandarin, Orange Park, downtown Jacksonville and the Mayport Ferry.

Social rides are especially popular for slower or beginning riders as well as veterans more interested in socializing than speed. More accomplished riders just might want to give the slower pace a try.

Who knows, you might rediscover just how good ice cream can be on a warm day.


